CC1 – Fingering weight yarn, 420 yds.

CC2 – Fingering weight yarn,

420 yds. 618

US Size F (3.75 mm) hook

Stitch markers

Tapestry needle

Bead 1 – 370 Size 6 Seed Beads

Bead 2 – 66 Feature Beads, up to 6mm or 66 more Seed Beads

Steel Crochet Hook US Size 10 (1.15mm) or smaller

Gauge

20 Dc = 4" (not critical)

Notes

- RS is identified by holding the shawl so that the rows slant up and to the left. Place a marker to mark the right side for easy reference.
- All increases are worked on the WS rows. This is achieved by working the first DC of the row in the first st instead of the second as usual.
- All design patterns are worked on the RS. The bpdc will be worked on the WS, but will appear on the RS
- Ch 3 counts as a dc throughout. Be sure to place your final DC of each row in the top of the turning ch and count it in your row count.

- Beads are added on RS and WS and are optional. You may disregard any bead placement and it will not affect the pattern.
- Wedge refers to each skinny, vertical triangle that originates from the Set Up section.
- Sections refer to the horizontal sections of the same color.
- This pattern contains instructions for the "bead stitch" and "beaded crochet." Please note, these are two different techniques and will be described as they are worked.
